Rally News

Mother Nature heaped snow on the Dempster Highway to the point that it was closed for 3 days (and nights). Eagle Plains isn't a resort, but it can be fun. As it turned out, only one team did the entire planned route; the rest chose to skip non-scored sections; some had seen Inuvik once and that was enough under the conditions.

Eight days and 25 teams generates some stories (Duh!). Linking up by radio was the safest way to travel, often with the call "stuffed" followed by "I'll come back and help".

The problems make the top of the list. When blizzard conditions made the Blackwater TSD on Day 2 unscorable, the guys in #14 led a small group through anyway until they tried a wide line through a corner, to be stopped by a stump. They rejoined the rally much later in a rental truck. Most heartbreaking was the ice-slalom-winfollowed-by-dead engine of the Paul Eklund/R. Dale Kraushaar Forester. A long-suffering Impreza clutch gave up at the conclusion of that same session. Somewhat different results when the Audi ended up on its roof, only needing to cover the sunroof glass to continue once back on its wheels. The Valdez ice slalom was at least run- the Quesnel course was under so much crusty snow that the grader couldn't plow a course. The Valdez folk were experiencing snowfall in 2-foot dumps such that a road was blocked off and the course was up to one and back; grading an ice race course was impossible. Snow was so deep that painting their names in the tall vertical snow banks marked streets!

As a scoring contest, once away from the top three, the scores spread out. The 2WD Mini of Gary Webb and Alfa master Marc Goldfarb became the winners after the tight contest with Eklund/Kraushaar was concluded with the frozen motor.

Thunderbird (February 11-12) Sixty optimistic entrants gathered in Cache Creek, B.C. to participate in the annual dead-of-winter tour. Half of them were from B.C., 12 from Washington, 6 Oregon, and 8 from Alberta.

Over the 15 hours of rally, about half was TSD's, with 453 miles covered. Nice weather, too. No blizzard. Lower elevations featured bare roads, while the upper elevations had old, hard snow.



Early gravel became the expected snow for the McMillen/Crippen Subaru RX. Their 36 points was good for 6th.

There were only two DNF's, both older cars with engine problems that had them limping home rather than stranded.

Rallymaster Paul Westwick did away with tie-prone winter scoring, making the overall win by Satch

Carlson/Russ Kraushaar, in the light '69 Saab Sonett, all

the more awesome at 15 points.

Second overall went to Glenn Wallace and the senior Kraushaar in a more conventional Subaru Forester with 26 seconds of error over the 52 scored checkpoints.

Since sophisticated Unlimited rally computers are allowed in the Historic class (cars older than 25 years), three of the five lowest scores were in that class. 19 Novice teams bravely tried out the winter sport.

A new variation on the pre-rally scramble when a fire in the power room of the Merritt Ramada Inn on the Tuesday preceding the rally caused a revamp of carefully made plans. The Nicola Inn was fully booked, mostly with rallyists. The rally buys the motel rooms of the workers, and with 14 of these staff crews to shuffle, Paul was a busy man.

Plus, with friends, Paul revived his Saab 96 in the

weeks preceding the rally.

The route was a predictable mix of past TSD's. The roads are graded for logging, with the ongoing pressure to rid the forests of the pine beetles that have decimated 60% of that "crop". Sadly, a large percentage is only suitable for making pellets for stove fuel.

It took me a while to figure it out: the lack of stumps. Ron pointed out big mechanical cutters that cut the trees off low to the ground. The logger must just set the blade apparatus on the foot of snow and pull a lever.

At the Saturday night Kelowna stop, Paul's scoring activity was interrupted for presentation of a special trophy commemorating 25 years of Thunderbird rally
