Dan and I completed our No Alibi survey run a couple of weekends ago, assisted by the incomparable and ever helpful Marinus and Renee Damm. For the most part the route is set with the exception of a couple of small things that will have to wait till the measurement run for final determination.

If you like wind turbines, stunning vistas, and/or "MP 1", you're in luck because we've managed to squeeze at least 50% more of those into the same No Alibi package you've come to know and love (warning, contents may settle during shipping).

The 2012 No Alibi will be based in the Tri-Cities (start location, overnight, and finish). A considerable amount of the route -- around 80% -- will be all new, never before used roads. And not coincidently, we'll spend a good portion of Saturday in Northeast Oregon in the Pendleton area. Patchy snow dotted the ground on the old highway over the Blue Mountains, and during our lunch break we were able to chat with the Damms on simplex about 75 miles away on the other side of the Columbia where they were checking out the Sunday route.

As usual, the meal arrangements continue to be a struggle to organize. Two days after the checkout we secured park reservations for our tertiary location choice. Our first choices were snapped up in the meantime due to high demand during graduation weekend when the rally takes place.

* Lessons Learned, by Marvin Crippen

Now that the insurance check has been cashed I feel a bit freer to talk about my recent off road experience working on Alcan.

A few of these points were brought up in the last WAG, but are worth repeating. The primary lesson was don't skimp on preparation, even if "you're only going for one day". While it may be just one day, it could be one really bad day. Especially if you decided not to worry about taking heavy gloves and boots (luckily a heavy coat was packed).

Cash is king; plan ahead and either get a good stash before you leave or hit an ATM as soon as you enter Canada. I received a significant discount on the tow truck by paying cash and keeping it off the official radar. The corollary to that is plastic hates you. Last time I ran Alcan I alerted both my credit card and bank about the dates and itinerary and had no problems. Since it was "just one day" (there it is again) I didn't bother with it this time. Having your credit card stop working on the middle of the trip back isn't fun. But even the alert is no guarantee, Renee did that for Totem and still had trouble getting money out of the ATM (again cash is king).

I'd like to thank everyone who gave us a hand. It was very comforting to get so much support before, during, and after the tow. Not to mention getting an escort all the way back in case trouble developed.

* \$20,000 per foot -From Wash. DOT: "Starting later this spring, WSDOT and contractor crews also will resume work on the \$551 million project that builds a wider, safer and more reliable stretch of I-90 from <u>Hyak to Keechelus Dam</u>. No Alibi update, as well as worker recruitment.


