That includes the well-planned breaks on each day, with bag lunches on Sunday at the Grand Coulee Dam visitor's center parking lot. Dan called upon a local Coulee City sandwich shop to provide bag lunches, each labeled per the team's order. (Buy local!)

Dinner at Spokane's Old Spaghetti Factory was a bit tight, but no one seemed to miss not having a planned program. Good company, after all. Rallymaster Dan notes, "Feedback was positive, folks liked the roads quite a lot. Add Douglas county to the list of "don't use on a rally" now that we know the default speed limit is 25. Probably more interactions with deputies from different counties, including one that called and had a conversation with me the week after the event (Whitman). More interactions with upset locals than I recall in prior events. Lots of flats, more than I recall in prior events. Fortunately feedback forms and in-person comments were positive."

There was one DNF when the spare tire wasn't going to work. Another notable flat tire was the Scoring/Sweep Saturn. The Damms helped get that one back to civilization, where Costco was available to fit a replacement.
