Organizers need to be able to point out to "interested authorities" that the rallyists have no reason to speed- the provision for TD's is part of the rules.

Since TD's are taken in whole minutes plus 30 seconds, the front runners move back after taking the TD, which can result in queuing to occupy the timing slots – Ron Sorem said he timed 6 cars in 4 minutes at Totem.
