The Editor said: "You have a month to get me an article on Nor'Wester".

Well when The Editor speaks, you ask "How high?" (Actually you wonder WTF?). But there has been some news on the rally...

First, in April, we went out to double-check the odo check and streamlined things a bit, deviating from the original 1967 & 1997 routes, but eliminating what have become some very slow sections through Ellensburg. Then the first regularity was altered to allow an earlier rest stop and fuel options.

A major part of our scenic tour into Oregon fell, into the canyon, over the winter. A 13 minute longer route has been described to us as 3-foot deep mud (4-wheel drive truck with chains). The Forest Service has no budget for immediate repairs on little used roads, unless needed for fire suppression, and if then, no access anyway. Now even if the muddy dries up in two months, we probably won't negotiate the ruts in our cars. So the patchwork quilt of measured sections eventually came together as a re-write, with a minimal loss of mileage (although no Oregon) and a bit earlier finish at the Red Lion. As Roy mentioned on the website, allowing "a bit more time for nourishment, libation, and harrowing tales of the day". (Something us old timers might be looking to enjoy).

During No Alibi, I used a long break between assignments to mark some more checkpoint locations for Nor'Wester. Yes, you will see a brief section of familiar road. On the other hand, you won't know where we are hiding. A congested area used as a long Quiet Zone on No Alibi will be bypassed to appease the neighbors. The shortcut is fun too!

I've always felt that nighttime checkpoints present a problem for crews and competitors alike. For crews, it's hard to see the numbers without headlights shining on the cars. For competitors any distraction can lead to mistakes, and slowing to be courteous/cautious/safe when coming up to a car parked along the route could lead to a second or two penalty. With this in mind, I checked the sunset/twilight times for Saturday evening, and by reversing the late day loop, we avoid any such conflict, and turn a downhill gravel into an uphill gravel. Always a good thing!

Our Check Out crew is anxious to get out on the route, but Roy and I need to do a final measurement. And, if we can turn a "Bridge Out - Road Closed", that we encountered on survey, into another regularity we'll do it. Checkpoint crews will just have to be as little of a distraction as possible.
